# Logline

The Country Club is a comedy centering on two young women (Fiona Robert and Sophia Robert) who hatch a plan to win a junior golf tournament prize at a prestigious Hamptons country club. But once they encounter the quirky, wealthy patrons at the club, they are thrust on an adventure of mistaken identity, love and finding friendship in the most unlikely of people.

# **Synopsis**

Elsa Cartwright, a precocious teen golfer who is working a summer job at a driving range mistakenly receives an invitation to play in a junior tournament at a prestigious east coast country club intended for a socialite who shares her name. Elsa and her sister hatch a plan to win the golf tournament and the prize money. Upon arrival at the club, the girl's plan quickly becomes derailed when they meet an eccentric member, Roger Kowalski (played by John Higgins) who is determined to befriend Elsa in order to distract her and take home the gold himself. Meanwhile, Elsa's sister becomes caught in a love triangle with a preppy heartthrob Marshall, and Roger's sweet and kind caddy, Lumer. The girl's plan is put to the test when Marshall discovers their true identity and betrays them. Through all the obstacles, the girls stick together finding romance, friendship and lots of laughs.

### **Production Notes**

The Robert Sisters debut comedy is a colorful, laugh out loud romp. One of those rare gems with a childlike sense of play where it seems like anything could happen. At first The Country Club feels like an American teen comedy but it slowly spins off the handle into an unpredictable farce. "We had a lot of fun filming this movie and we just want audiences to be able to relax into a good time and know there's a happy ending with us," says director Fiona Robert. The strong ensemble cast of New York comedians is led by Saturday Night Live's John Higgins whose comedy writing trio "Please Don't Destroy" has been the breakout star of the last two SNL seasons with their viral sketch videos. And The Robert Sisters have gifted Higgins with the perfect part to showcase his star qualities: Roger Kowalski, an overgrown manchild who marches around in a campy all pink ensemble having adult tantrums. The Robert Sisters discovered Higgins pre-SNL from his audition tape. "He just gave the best audition," director Fiona Robert recalls, "he was hyperventilating and loud and just nailed it!" Elaine Hendrix, best known for *Dynasty* and the 1998 remake of *The Parent Trap*, plays Roger's mother, a perfect foil with her crisp comedic timing. Hendrix has collaborated with The Robert Sisters twice now, and will appear in their second film A View of the World from Fifth Avenue, premiering this summer at Geena Davis' Bentonville Film Festival June 2023.

The Robert Sisters clearly know their comedic history. Their diverse cast of memorable characters are drawn from the Italian tradition of commedia dell'arte, the absurd situations straight out of Molière, and throughout there are witty lines reminiscent of French New Wave filmmakers like Truffaut and Goddard. The characters are larger than life and yet, the campy humor and stylization gives it all a sense of self-awareness, the Robert Sisters are also in on the joke.

The film was initially inspired by an improvisational sketch by The Dark Day Players, an improv group that director Fiona Robert was a part of in her final year at New York University. Robert developed the sketch further at home with her sister and brought pages into a screenwriting class to perfect scenes. The Robert Sisters also drew inspiration from their childhood where they grew up going to a country club with their grandmother. A stroke left Grandma Robert able to golf with only one hand. There is a nod to their grandmother in the film, a sassy Betty White type member who coincidentally, also only golfs with one hand – and of course, is better than all the other players.

## Redefining a Genre

The Country Club is a fresh take on the golf comedy from the perspective of two female comedy writers. While comparisons to classics such as Caddyshack and Happy Gilmore are inevitable, an actual rewatch of those films may be a cringe worthy reminder that some jokes don't age. The Country Club on the other hand, takes aim at many recognizable tropes, turning them on their heads to an original, entertaining effect.

A sports comedy is also rarely this beautiful. Each shot is perfectly curated, showcasing a distinct palette of pastel colors, native to the wallpaper and fabrics in East Coast country clubs. The filmmakers make sure to feature the sprawling greens of the golf course, and the small oddities of the Country Club world such as "Cellphone Rooms." After everything is said and done, you'll want to join this club.

### **Editing and Music**

Bringing together the hilarious takes and working the comedic timing of the film fell to Editor Lucas Celler, who the Robert Sisters sat together with in the editing room. Celler had to navigate sometimes improvised takes, and time reaction shots down to the second to get the comedic moments exactly right.

The score was composed by Amit May Cohen, who created catchy themes to accentuate each character's personality. Amit's colorful melodies can also be heard in Disney Channel's Zombies 2 scored with renowned composer George S. Clinton.

For everyone involved in *The Country Club*, the sheer fun of making the comedy translates into the final product: a lighthearted coming of age story that follows two sisters chasing the American Dream. One leaves with a sense of optimism and a smile. Says producer Sophia Robert "It's a fun experience for all ages! We had such fun on set, we had to wait for the crew to stop laughing between takes!"
